- We encouraged KPPCSD and KFPD to work in coordination while the KPPCSD considers all realistic locations for the police department in Kensington, evaluates the tradeoffs of each location, including the cost and operational benefits to be realized at each of these locations. We support a rational qualitative and quantitative process to make an informed decision.
- We continue to advocate that KPPCSD and KFPD evaluate the costs and benefits of unification (consolidation) of the two districts into a single efficient district with one board and one general manager and staff. We concluded that one board, in the form used successfully by small and large communities nationwide is the best option for efficient, optimized planning, administration and governance.
- Participated with John Gioia's tree obstruction view ordinance working group to develop new regulations that promote cooperation in addressing tree view blockage.
- Hosted the annual 2022 KPOA membership meeting with keynote speaker Richard Berkson on "How Public Services Can Be Provided More Effectively" and featured Lou Ann Texeira, Local Agency Formation Commission to inform the community on the district consolidation process. Additional presenters on Kensington matters included Supervisor Gioia and our Police Chief Gancasz and Fire Battalion Chief Beckman.
- Sent letters and spoke at meetings of the BART Board regarding El Cerrito Plaza station access and the need to maintain parking at the station.
- Met with the Police Chief on plans for evacuation and parking restrictions along roadways on red flag days and on minimal acceptable office space requirements for the department.
- Participation in the Kensington public paths working group.
- Improved the KPOA website with its information on issues as well as an updated directory of local organizations, our elected officials and the principal agencies that serve Kensington for easy reference by residents.
